RESOLUTION NO. 19-009, Series of 2019

TITLE: A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO CONSOLIDATED SERVICE PLAN FOR CHAMBERS HIGHPOINT METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 1 AND CHAMBERS HIGHPOINT METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 2

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 16-063, the Town Council of the Town of Parker (the "Town") on October 3, 2016, approved a Consolidated Service Plan ("Original Service Plan") for the organization of the Chambers Highpoint Metropolitan District No. 1 and Chambers Highpoint Metropolitan District No. 2 ("Districts"); and

WHEREAS, the Districts were organized pursuant to Orders and Decrees issued by the District Court of Douglas County on November 22, 2016, and recorded on December 1, 2016, at Reception Nos. 2016087393 and 2016087394 of the County of Douglas, Colorado, real property records; and

WHEREAS, a First Amendment to Consolidated Service Plan for Chambers Highpoint Metropolitan District No. 1 and Chambers Highpoint Metropolitan District No. 2 ("Service Plan Amendment") was filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Parker; and

WHEREAS, the Town, pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-101, et seq., (the "Special Districts Act") and Chapter 10.11 of the Town of Parker Municipal Code (the "Code"), has the authority to approve service plans and service plan amendments for metropolitan districts that are organized within the Town's boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has reviewed the Service Plan Amendment, the evidence and related exhibits, and has determined that the same meets the municipal approval criteria under the Special District Act and the Code, and therefore, has determined to adopt a resolution of approval of the Service Plan Amendment for the Districts; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the Service Plan Amendment is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, notice of the public hearing before the Town Council for its consideration of the Service Plan Amendment was duly published in the *Douglas County News-Press* on January 10, 2019, in accordance with the Special Districts Act, as evidenced by the Affidavit of Publication attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Special Districts Act, notice of the hearing before the Town Council was also duly mailed by first class mail on January 10, 2019, to all property owners within the boundaries of the Districts, to interested persons, defined as follows: (1) the Colorado Division of Local Government; and (2) the governing body of any municipality or special district which has levied an ad valorem tax within the next preceding tax year, and which has boundaries within a radius of three miles of the Districts' boundaries, as evidenced by the Certificate of Mailing of Notice of Hearing to Three Mile Radius Entities attached hereto as **Exhibit 3** and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the boundaries of the Districts are wholly contained within the boundaries of the Town; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Special Districts Act and the Code, the Town Council held a public hearing on the Service Plan Amendment for the Districts on February 4, 2019, which was continued to March 4, 2019 and then to March 18, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council considered the Service Plan Amendment, and all other testimony and evidence presented at said hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PARKER, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

- <u>Section 1</u>. The Town Council hereby determines that the hearing before the Town Council was open to the public; all interested parties were heard or had the opportunity to be heard; and all relevant testimony and evidence submitted to the Town Council was considered.
- Section 2. The Town Council hereby determines that the requirements of the Special Districts Act and the Code, relating to the filing of the Service Plan Amendment for the Districts, and the requirements of C.R.S. § 32-1-204 relating to notice of the hearing by the Town Council, and the requirements of the Special Districts Act and the Code, relating to the approval by the Town Council, have been fulfilled.
- Section 3. Upon consideration of the Service Plan Amendment for the Districts, and evidence at the public hearing on the Service Plan, the Town Council does find, determine and declare, as required by C.R.S. § 32-1-203 and the Code, as follows:
- 1. There continues to be sufficient existing and projected need for organized service in the area to be serviced by the Districts;
- 2. That the existing service in the area to be served by the Districts continues to be inadequate for present and projected needs;
- 3. That the Districts are capable of providing economical and sufficient service to the area within their boundaries;
- 4. That the area included in the Districts has, or will have, the financial ability to discharge the proposed indebtedness on a reasonable basis;
- 5. That adequate service is not or will not be available to the area through the Town or other existing quasi-municipal corporations, including existing districts, within a reasonable time and on a comparable basis;
- 6. That the facility and service standards of the Districts are compatible with the facility and service standards of the Town;
- 7. That the Service Plan Amendment is in substantial compliance with the Town's master plan;

- 8. That the Service Plan Amendment is in substantial compliance with the county, regional or state long-range water quality management plan for the area;
- 9. That approval of the Service Plan Amendment for the Districts will be in the best interests of the area to be served;
- 10. That approval of the Service Plan Amendment for the Districts will be in the best interests of the residents or future residents of the area proposed to be served;
- 11. That the Service Plan Amendment is in substantial compliance with Sections 10.11.010, et seq., of the Code; and
- 12. That the approval of the Service Plan Amendment for the Districts will not foster urban development that is remote from or incapable of being integrated with existing urban areas, or place a burden on the Town or adjacent jurisdictions to provide urban services to residents of the Districts.
- <u>Section 4</u>. The Town Council hereby finds that approval of the Service Plan Amendment is in the best interests of the property to be served, the Town and the Districts.
- Section 5. The Town Council hereby approves the Service Plan Amendment for the Districts as submitted.

<u>Section 6</u>. A certified copy of this Resolution shall be filed in the records of the Town and the Douglas County Clerk and Recorder.

I. INTRODUCTION

The Consolidated Service Plan ("Service Plan") for the Chambers Highpoint Metropolitan Districts Nos. 1 - 2 (the "Districts"), was approved by the Town of Parker ("Town") pursuant to Resolution No. 16-063 on October 3, 2016. The Districts were organized to finance public improvements for the benefit of the residents, property owners, and taxpayers of the Districts. This Combined First Amendment to Service Plan ("First Amendment") is applicable to both Districts and is intended to be read in conjunction with the Service Plan.

II. FIRST AMENDMENT

The increases in the Development Fee set forth in this First Amendment are necessary so that residents, tenants and property owners within the Districts are able to obtain water and sanitary sewer taps to serve their property, and to pay for the infrastructure required to connect the taps to the water and sewer provider, as set forth in that certain Amended and Restated Regional Water and Wastewater Service Agreement dated October 10, 2016, between Stonegate Village Metropolitan District and Compark Business Campus Metropolitan District.

As of the date of this First Amendment, the Districts have no residents. The Boards of Directors (the "Board") of the Districts have determined that it is in the best interests of future residents, property owners and taxpayers of the Districts to amend Section VI.F of the Service Plan to increase the Development Fee in order to pay water and sanitary sewer tap fees and to pay for infrastructure that will enable the property in the Districts to receive water and sanitary sewer services. The Board of Directors believes that the Development Fee increase will best serve the economic interests of the Districts' current and future property owners, electors and residents. Except for the changes to the Development Fees, there have been no material changes to any of the information, assumptions or projections furnished in the initial Service Plan and reviewed by the Town.

III. AMENDMENTS

A. Section II. <u>Definitions</u> of the Service Plan shall be amended to revise and restate the definition of Development Fee and to include the following definition of SFE, to read in full as follows:

Development Fee: means the one-time development or system development fee imposed by the Districts on a per-unit (residential) or per-SFE (non-residential) basis at or prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy for any unit or structure, imposed in accordance with Section VI.F. of the Service Plan. The Development Fee may be used to purchase taps and to pay for the infrastructure that will enable the residents, tenants and property owners in the Districts to receive water and sanitary sewer service.

<u>SFE</u>: means the equivalent water or sewer service demand associated with a single family residential unit (based on a ¾ inch tap), as from time to time set forth and revised in the Rules and Regulations of Stonegate Village Metropolitan District.

B. Section VI. F. <u>Debt Repayment Sources</u> of the Service Plan shall be amended to read in full as follows:

Each of the Districts may impose a mill levy on taxable property within its boundaries as a primary source of revenue for repayment of debt service and for operations and maintenance. In no event shall the debt service mill levy in any District exceed the Commercial Maximum Debt Mill Levy or the Residential Maximum Debt Mill Levy, as applicable, or the Maximum Debt Mill Levy Imposition Term for Residential Districts.

The Districts may also collect a Development Fee from property within the Service Area, provided that such Development Fee does not exceed the following limits:

- 1. For each single-family detached or attached residential unit, the Development Fee shall not exceed Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000).
- 2. For each multi-family residential unit, the Development Fee shall not exceed Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000).
- 3. For uses other than a single-family or multi-family residential structure, the Development Fee shall not exceed Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) per SFE of water and/or wastewater demand.

The Development Fee set forth in this Service Plan may increase by up to the Consumer Price Index for Denver-Boulder, all items, all urban consumers (or its successor index for any years for which Consumer Price Index is not available) each year thereafter (as an inflation adjustment) commencing on January 1, 2019. The Development Fee shall be collected prior to issuance of a certificate of occupancy. Unless specifically authorized in the Intergovernmental Agreement, the Districts shall not impose or assess any fees, rates, tolls, penalties, or charges other than the Development Fee, as limited above, without first obtaining Town approval of an amendment to this Service Plan, which amendment shall be deemed to be a material modification hereof.

IV. EFFECT OF FIRST AMENDMENT

Except as specifically amended as set forth above, all other provisions of the Service Plan shall remain in full force and effect. To the extent there are any inconsistencies between this First Amendment and the Service Plan, this First Amendment shall control.
